

## HOW TO ARRIVE TO CAMPOBELLO DI LICATA

How to get to Campobello di Licata if you're landing at...:

...Catania's Airport -*Fontanarossa*- (the easiest way):

Once you get out from the front door of the airport, you just have to walk around 60 metres to the right in order to get a bus of the *SAIS Trasporti* company ([www.saistrasporti.it](http://www.saistrasporti.it)\*) that will take you to Canicatti [see annexed picture of the bus stop]. The trip takes about 2 and ½ hours, and it costs 10,80€ (you can buy the ticket inside the bus). Once at Canicatti you have to wait in the same place where you get off until the connection for Campobello di Licata arrives. The buses from Canicatti to Campobello have the following schedule:

7.55 - 8.55 - 10.25 - 11.45 - 12.25 - 13.30 - 14.25 - 14.55 - 15.25 - 17.25 - 19.00 - 20.20  
(this last one doesn't work on Saturdays).

It costs around 1,50€ (you can buy it to the driver) and it takes around 15 minutes. When you arrive to Campobello di Licata, which is a little town, tell the driver to stop at the last stop ("ultima fermata"). Then try to find a school called "Carnevale", placed in the short Carnevale Street (Via Carnevale) [see annexed map of Campobello]. If you have any problem you can call the school +39 0922870367 (probably an Italian speaker), Emilia Bella +39 3332013962 (Italian & English) or Willy Fernandez +39 3804693317 (Italian, English & Spanish).

...Palermo's Airport -*Punta Raisi*- (a little bit more difficult):

Go to the airport's down floor with the elevator and there you can get a train called *Trinacria Express* that will take you to Palermo's main station (Palermo-Stazione Centrale) which is the last stop. The trip is for 5,50€ and in less than 1 hour. There are lots of trains between 5.30 & 22.00 and you can take a look to the schedule at [www.unipa.it/~chimfis/trinacria\\_express.pdf](http://www.unipa.it/~chimfis/trinacria_express.pdf). IMPORTANT: once you buy the ticket don't forget to validate it in the yellow machines before getting inside the train, otherwise you can be punished.

Once you reach Palermo-Stazione Centrale you have to walk to the right side from the main door (in front of Giulio Cesare's Square) and reach the Paolo Balsamo Street (Via Paolo Balsamo). There you can get the bus of the *Cuffaro* company that will take you to Canicatti in almost 2 and ½ hours for 8,90€. You can buy the ticket in the bus. More information & schedules in [www.cuffaro.info](http://www.cuffaro.info). Once there, follow the instructions written above for Canicatti-Campobello.

Arriving by train: The best thing is to reach Catania by train. There are direct trains connecting Roma to Catania. Two during the day and two overnight. The trip takes about 12 hours. You also have direct trains from Milano and Torino. In this case the trip will be very long and please note that during the summer these trains are really overcrowded. When you are at Catania's railway station, and if you want to get a bus (easier & a shorter trip) you should walk to the bus station (around 200 metres to the North). Please follow the indications "landing in Catania" given above but write CATANIA in "partenza". For more information about trains visit [www.ferroviedellostato.it](http://www.ferroviedellostato.it).

For hitchhikers: in Italy hitchhiking is forbidden to do it on the on the motorway (where you have to pay): if you feel as a transgressor, ask for lifts only at the toll-barrier or at the stations. On the other roads it's more or less tolerated providing not to stay in dangerous places for cars to stop (police would kick you out in that case and anyway cars hopefully wouldn't stop).

\* In order to have an updated schedule of the buses from Catania's Airport to Canicatti, in the browser of SAIS' web site you should write AEROPORTO CATANIA in "partenza", CANICATTI in "destinazione" and then click on "ricerca".
